The Muslim community has raised be carried out for all deaths in England and Wales, without exception".

> Information published on a government website said that this will either concluded independently by a medical examiner or an investigation could be opened by a coroner.

A medical practitioner will be eligible According to the regulations laid before to be an attending practitioner and complete a medical certificate of cause of death (MCCD), if they have attended

the deceased in their lifetime. The main change is that attending practitioners must share the MCCD and proposed cause of death with a medical examiner, who will scrutinise these before submission to the registrar.

However, these changes made some a little bit anxious about what's next. Councillor Aziz, Chair of IMWS said, that he had concerns about the potential "unnecessary" delays in burials the reforms may bring.



Burial delay concerns in the Muslim community

The tradition in the Muslim community is to bury the deceased as soon as possible - sometimes even on the day of the passing, he said.

He said the services provided by the coroner's office and the bereavement services for many years accommodated everyone's needs regardless of faith.

However, he insists he is cautious about the inclusion of medical examiners into the mix before signing off.

He said: "If the availability of medical examiners are not in prioritised, this could potentially cause delays in relation to burials."

Mohammed Javed of the Sadqah Jariyah organisation said he was apprehensive about the new proposals, insisting it is important for the community to work hand in hand with the coroner, burial organisations and medical professionals so that people from all backgrounds can bury friends and family in a dignified manner.

He said: "Do we have enough people signed up to be medical examiners both in the hospital and out in the community?

"If bereavements happen over the weekend, what do we do? Those hours may not be sufficient. In the past, registrars have gone above and beyond in order to issue a green form, which allows us to bury our loved ones. You have to understand that they only work for two hours each day over the weekend."

He also said that there was a lack of awareness of these changes and more needs to be done to spread the word about

A Department of Health and Social Care spokesperson told Paigaam: "The impact of medical examiner scrutiny delaying funerals has been an important consideration when designing these reforms, and we have consulted closely with faith groups including the Muslim community.

"There is provision within the new system to minimise the potential of delays to burial while maintaining the integrity of the medical examiner system. Rapid release can be requested to prioritise cases that require urgent attention, including in accordance with faith groups' burial customs, and the new measures will be proportionate so as not to impose undue delays on the bereaved."

By definition – provided by the published paper on the government website - a medical examiner is a senior medical practitioner who is contracted for a number of sessions a week to provide independent scrutiny of causes of death, outside of their usual clinical duties.

They are trained in the legal and clinical elements of death certification processes and will not have been involved in caring for the patient.

Medical examiners have a number of responsibilities:

- They provide independent scrutiny of the causes of death.
- Give bereaved the opportunity to ask questions.
- Review medical records.

The document added: "Once the relevant attending practitioner and the medical examiner have completed their declarations of certification and scrutiny, and the cause of death is confirmed, the MCCD will be sent to the registrar by the

medical examiner rather than the attending practitioner.

"The representative of the deceased will be notified at the same time that they can now contact the registrar to arrange the registration of the death."

The updates, the first overhaul in more than 50 years, essentially mean a speedingup of the process immediately following a death, with the possible advantage to the Muslim community of speedy burial. The reforms are taking place under the aegis of the Department of Health and Social Care. Previously, doctors were only able to issue a medical certificate cause of death (MCCD) if they had attended the deceased within 28 days before death.

The changes will mean that medical practitioners can complete this certificate - without which a person cannot be buried - if they have attended the deceased "in their lifetime".

The doctors can propose a cause of death "to the best of their knowledge and belief".

Once the certificate is issued it then goes to a medical examiner, a senior practitioner, to complete it. After that the MCCD will be sent to the registrar, crucially without meeting a coroner at any stage in the process – unless there is a suspicion of death by unnatural causes.

With regards to pupil conduct, the report states that, 'behaviour at the school is superb' and 'pupils are curious and enthusiastic in lessons.'

Pupils were proud and excited to show the Inspectors the careers fair they had helped to organise and discussed upcoming thematic days such as Culture day and Enterprise day.

The report further states that pupils see 'positive, ambitious future for themselves'

through exposure to external speakers and local businesses and colleges.

Staff and leaders expressed admiration for the pupils and the school. A spokesperson for the school said: "I am incredibly proud of the school and what it has achieved since it opened its doors only seven short years ago.

"The report is a true testament to the hard work and effort of all the staff and leaders at the school.

"There is a real sense of community and we take pupils' education and wellbeing very seriously whilst providing ample opportunities for them to flourish and succeed in the real world.

Why calling someone a 'coconut' is not racist

Common sense has prevailed as District racist bone in her body". Judge, Vanessa Lloyd, exonerated 37-year old Marieha Hussain who broke down in tears as a not-guilty verdict was read out at Westminster magistrates' court last month.

The ruling was the culmination of an almost year-long ordeal, which saw 37-year-old Hussain lose her job, have her family's home address exposed by tabloid newspapers, and her reputation tarnished. The charge the psychology teacher faced was of a racially aggravated public order offence – undoubtedly a serious crime.

She was pictured at a protest, holding a placard with a drawing of a palm tree with coconuts falling off it. Stuck over two of those coconuts were the faces of Braverman and of the then-prime minister Rishi Sunak.

The photo had been posted on X by an anonymous Right-wing blog called Harry's Place and was going viral. "It doesn't get more racist than this," the post said. "Among anti-racists you find some of the worst racists of them all." Below was a reply from the Metropolitan Police, stating that they were "actively looking for" her. The post has since been viewed more than four million times.

Hussain was consequently subjected to an abusive police interview, late-night police harassment and was sacked from her job. The term Coconut suggests a Black or brown individual is akin to a traitor who has indulged in 'colonial' behaviour and opinion. Many believe the term coconut can be used in the spirit of free speech as a valid, albeit pejorative, critique.

But in the case of Hussain, this could not have been further from the truth as Westminster Magistrates' Court heard that she "quite obviously does not have a

The court that Hussain is a woman of "impeccable character", "She is a responsible and thoughtful citizen who genuinely cares about the plight of those less fortunate than her, who is prepared to exercise her democratic right to peaceful protest against injustice."

It was inevitable that Hussain would eventually be acquitted. The placard, as the judge ruled, was "part of the genre of political satire", and had "not proved to a criminal standard that it was abusive."

The case is also part of an alarming trend of people from ethnic backgrounds being policed for the use of intercultural language. While being a person of colour certainly does not give you the right to racially abuse someone, it does not take a degree in rocket science to understand that there is a difference between a word being adapted within an ethnic group, and a word being used as a slur to others. It is absolutely nonsensical to compare the

Hussain said she has no regrets. "I have had no regret about making that placard, taking it out and defending it."

Her decision to depict Braverman and Sunak as "coconuts", was based around the fact that the likes of Rishi Sunak, Suella Braverman and Nigel Farage and Stephen Yaxley-Lennon – aka Tommy Robinson are seemingly free to make inflammatory and divisive statements.

"I was trying to show that Sunak and Braverman hold the highest offices in our country, they've got so much power and influence," Hussain said. "Calling [pro-Palestine protests] 'hate marches', the Rwanda policy, the comments about Pakistani men. That fed into a really

dangerous rhetoric that is actually untrue. When asked whether she would use a similar coconut placard again at a future pro-Palestine rally, Hussain said: "Yes. It's political satire, it's protected speech and I have absolutely no reason not to carry that placard around again.

"It's been explained what it is and what it means," she said. "The most important thing is that, at its highest level, political critique is a really important element of addressing our politicians and its protected speech. I've been acquitted. It's absolutely completely legal for me to carry that placard around."

Israel's decision to ignite a wider war is dangerous

It couldn't be clearer that the escalation is coming from one side — Israel.

Israel's bombing of Lebanon is pulling the entire region towards a war of brutal proportions.

Israel may not have declared war on Lebanon, but when you are dropping bombs on a country's capital the formalities are academic.

The thousands of bombs that have been dropped over Lebanon by a fleet of Israeli aircraft have also destroyed many homes and other civilian infrastructure, displaced tens of thousands, and killed paramedics and journalists.

Opening what is effectively a third front in its war of aggression — since the horrific assault on Gaza is already tied to an escalated ethnic cleansing operation in the West Bank.

This could easily ignite a wider conflict: militias in Iraq have already begun firing rockets into the Golan Heights, Syrian territory unlawfully occupied by Israel.

Israel's decision to expand the war into Lebanon is driven by a series of goals that will impact the entire region. We must become accustomed to the idea that Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu is interested in years of fighting, and disproportionate destruction across the Middle East.

This begs the question 'Does Kier Starmer's newly elected Labour government want to see its missions derailed?'

The shadow of Iraq haunted the last Labour government and ultimately led to its downfall.

Will Starmer's premiership be overshadowed, by another catastrophic war in the Middle East?

The boming of Gaza, which the British people oppose even more strongly than they did Iraq, has led to sustained peace protests demonstrating the strength of public anger at Israel's genocidal conduct.

Like US President Joe Biden, Foreign Secretary David Lammy insists he does not want this. That Britain is doing everything it can to avoid escalation.

And this makes Lammy's claim that stopping arms exports to Israel "would lead to a wider war and an escalation that we in the UK are committed to stopping"

utterly absurd.

Britain is facilitating Israel's escalation of the war, and only an end to all arms sales — backed up by real diplomatic penalties including cancelling the Israel-UK "road map" giving it favoured trading status will change that.

By refusing to act, the Labour government is endorsing Israel's project — which is not the elimination of Hamas, but the erasure of the Palestinians as a people and suppression of any possibility of the independent, sovereign Palestine that Britain, like the US, claims to want to see.

That is not what Labour members want. It is not what the public want. Lammy and Keir Starmer must be made to change course.



Local community pays tribute to Haji Fakir Bhai Daji

The local community have paid their respects to Fakir bhai Daji who devoted his life to Islam and serving the local community with his kindness, understanding and an endearing love for the Muslim community.

Born in Alipor in India, Fakir bhai, the youngest of five brothers was educated at the MTB College in Surat gaining a BCom degree. Upon graduating he took up a teaching job in Navsari. He arrived in the UK in 1962.

Despite attaining a job at an engineering firm, and also being elected the Chair of IMWS in 1964, he decided to return to India in 1968 in order to be with his family. However, in 1977, he would return with his family and settled in Batley for good.

Such was his devotion to the community and the respect he had earned from within the vicinity and from amongst the Ulema, he was elected to the position of Chair of IMWS. He held this role from 1981 to 1985, playing a pivotal role in relation to the purchase of a property where Jame Masjid is now located.

He was also instrumental in purchasing various properties in the vicinity, developing them into Madressah's and various other projects that were of benefit to the local community.

He was very committed to supporting IMWS and regularly attended meetings and events. He was given an award for his support and services to IMWS. He was also a Trustee of ICWA and served in various positions, including committee member and as a trustee. Since a very young age, he was known for his piety and actively took part in Tabligh Jamaat.

He was very well connected with the Ulema both in the UK and overseas and had great respect for them. Indeed, many of his children, including the late Moulana Imran were known for their deep love for Islam.

Fakir bhai had a very friendly personality and was very approachable. He also served as a school governor at Birkdale High School and always actively encouraged young people to work hard and encouraged them to study.

He also played an important role in the Muslim Burial Council of North Kirklees, helping ensure the Muslim community were able to bury their loved ones during weekends and bank holidays. His humbleness, patience in the face of trials and tribulations, honesty and his love for the Ulema never wavered throughout his many years of public service.

IMWS and community worker said: "Fakir bhai and myself worked together in IMWS for a long time. His legacy is marked by the purchasing and renovation of the Sirdar Mill, which is now Jame Masjid Henry Street.

"He was blessed with a humble nature and he was a good listener. The community has lost a real stalwart. It will not be easy to fill the vacum created by his passing."

Former IMWS Chair, Rafik Dabhad said Fakir Chacha was always on hand should be feel the need to ask for help and advice.

Community mourns passing of Haji Ghulam Maniyar

Tributes have been paid to Ghulam bhai Maniyar who dedicated his life to helping others for over 45 years.

A former Councillor for the Batley East ward and a devoted pillar of the Batley community, Ghulam bhai dedicated his life to serving his constituents and the whole community. He was well known in the community for arranging burial services for over 45 years.

Born in Khambbiya, Alipore, Ghulam bhai received his primary and secondary education in Bombay. After graduating, he would often spend time in Bombay, working in the family business which was owned by his father.

Upon arriving in the UK, he initially worked in the transport industry. He joined IMWS in the 70's, serving as secretary and treasurer before joining the burial committee and serving on the IMWS Executive committee for well over 40 years.

In February 2018, Ghulam bhai was presented with an award by IMWS, in recognition of his long and dedicated service to the community.

Ghulam bhai took full responsibility for the burial process, from getting death certificates to arranging funerals and completing all the relevant paperwork.

He played a part in IMWS purchasing the private land at the top of Dewsbury cemetery. He also contributed to the Muslim community being allowed to bury their loved ones during weekends and bank holidays. Such was his influence; he attained the trust of Coroners, regularly meeting with them, discussing burial activities in a professional capacity, whilst also getting to know them on a personal level, such was his enthusiasm and endearing personality.

The fact of the matter was that he dedicated over 45 years to serving the community with passion and dedication.

He was the founding member of Muslim Burial Council North Kirklees along with the Muslim Burial Services which was set up in 2021 to provide the provisions for burial in the North Kirklees Area.

He also served as a committee member and trustee at MPIT, Madina Masjid. Ghulam bhai was a staunch supporter of the Ulema, providing support and advice.

This was ingrained by his father, who founded Khambiya Darul Uloom in India. Ghulam bhai carried on and supported the work and dedicated his life to the institution.

A humble man who was always ready to help needy people, Ghulam bhai regularly visited the sick and the elderly in their homes and in hospital.

Ghulam bhai was praised for his dedication and community spirit by Moulana Bodiyat, who led the Janazah namaz at Mount Pleasant Madresah Hall.

Over a thousand people, young and old, attended his janazah prayer. Many also took the time to go to Batley cemetery for the burial.

IMWS Chair, Aziz Daji said the community has lost a special man who dedicated his life to serving the community with distinction.

He said: "Ghulam bhai made a big contribution to the local community as a councillor and community worker, helping to tackle issues and make improvements in the area.

"His hard work and integrity were a constant throughout his many years of public service. His legacy is marked by a lifetime of selfless dedication, distinguished leadership, and a profound impact on the community he served.

IMWS provide much needed aid to the people of Gaza

provided much needed aid in association to our long- term charity partner, Palestine Welfare House which is based in Gaza in order to distribute aid urgently to displaced Palestinians who have been subjected to indiscriminate bombing since October 2023.

Thanks to the generous donations from people within the community, Palestinian Welfare House has implemented a number of humanitarian projects for the affected families in the Gaza strip.

Through comprehensive assessments, strategic partnerships and efficient logistics, aid was delivered to 475 families in the Osama Ben Zaid Shelter Center, Alsaftawy town, Amwas Shelter Center, Alnazla town, Amro Ben Alaas Shelter Center, Shaikh Radwan town, Fahd Alsabah Shelter Center, Masqat Shelter Center, Alnazla town and the Kamal Adwan Hospital in North Gaza.

Those who received aid include those who have had their houses completely or partially destroyed, along with orphans in the most affected areas, who were the powdered milk cans for babies, in order to save them from malnutrition.

Food parcels consisted of basic food items such as 4 kg rice, 4 kg of rice, 2kg of wheat, tomato paste, 800g of powdered milk, 2.9 litter of cooking oil, horse beans salt, green peas, canned chickpeas, fish, lintels, spaghetti, 12 packets of Maggie, canned Halva, canned chicken, tea and tuna.

Despite Palestine Welfare House he facing several challenges, including security concerns, resource constraints, and limited access to certain areas, the distribution of urgent aid played a vital role in supporting affected and displaced Palestinians in Gaza during a challenging period.

Munir Daji of IMWS thanked members for taking the time to donate money to Gaza and appealed for prayers and donations for all those who are suffering in such a noble and sacred land.

He said: "Thank you very much for your donations to IMWS, your donations have





મુસ્લિમોની વકફ પ્રોપર્ટી ઉપર કબજો કરવા તરફ મોદીની નજર

ગયા મહીનાના પયગામના અંકમાં ભારત ખાતે વકફ એક્ટમાં સુધારાના કાયદાની રજૂઆત પાર્લામેન્ટમાં કરવામાં આવી હતી અને તેનો જોરદાર વિરોધ થયો હતો તેના સમાચાર અત્રે આપવામાં આવ્યા હતા. આ વકફ સુધારા બીલ ઉપર વિગતથી ચર્ચા કરવા તેને જેપીસી (જોઈન્ટ પાર્લામેન્ટરી કમિટી)માં મોકલવામાં આવ્યું હતું. જે મુજબ વિવિધ મુસ્લિમ સંસ્થાઓ અને નિષ્ફાાંતોએ તેના ઉપર તબક્કાવાર ચર્ચા કરી હતી. જેમાં ઓલ ઈન્ડિયા મુસ્લિમ પર્સનલ લો બોર્ડ (AIMPLB)ના સભ્યો. (AIMIM) ના વડા અને સાંસદ અસીસુદ્દીન ઓવેશી તથા અન્ય સમિતીઓએ તેના નફા નુકસાન અંગે મંતવ્યો દર્શાવ્યા હતા. ખાસ કરીને ડી.એમ. (જિલ્લા કલેકટર)ને આપવામાં આવી રહેલ પાવરનો વિરોધ કરવામાં આવ્યો હતો.

આ મિટીંગમાં આમ આદમીના સાંસદ સંજય સિંહ, ચાણક્ય લો યુનિવર્સિટીના વાઈસ ચાન્સેલર અને બંધારણના નિષ્ણાંત ફૈઝાન મુસ્તફા વગેરેઓએ સુધારાઓ ઉપર જોરદાર દલીલો રજૂ કરી બિલનો વિરોધ કર્યો હતો. બીલમાં અન્ય જોગવાઈ ઉપર પણ ચર્ચા કરવામાં આવી હતી. આ મિટીંગની દલીલોમાં ઉગ્ર રીતે શાબ્દિક બોલાચાલી થઈ હતી. વકફ મિલ્કતોના દસ્તાવેજીકરણના વિષય ઉપર પણ ગરમાગરમ દલીલો જોવા મળી હતી. આ જેપીસી કમિટીનું અધ્યક્ષ પદ જગદંબિકા પાલ કરી રહ્યા છે.

યુ.કે.માં લાચબ્રેરીના દરવાજાઓ બંધ

યુ.કે. ખાતે વર્ષોથી લોકલ કાઉન્સિલો તરફથી લાયબ્રેરીની સુવિધાઓ પૂરી પાડવામાં આવે છે. ૨૦૧૬થી આજિંદન સુધી ૧૮૦ થી વધુ લાયબ્રેરીઓ બંધ કરી દેવામાં આવી છે અથવા તો તેને ઈન્ડીપેન્ડન્ટ બોડીને સુપ્રત કરવામાં આવી છે. અને હજુ ઘણી લાયબ્રેરીઓ ઉપર બંધ થવાના વાદળો ઘેરાયેલા છે. લગભગ ૯૫૦થી વધુ લાયબ્રેરીઓના કલાકો પણ ઓછા કરવામાં આવ્યા છે, જેના કારણે અનેક વર્કરોએ તેમની નોકરીઓ પણ ગુમાવી છે. બ્રિટન ખાતે અનેક શહેરોમાં લાયબ્રેરી બંધ કરવાના લોકલ ઓથોરિટીના નિર્ણય સામે વિરોધ પ્રદર્શનો જોવા મળી રહ્યા છે. પરંતુ તેની નોંધ લેવામાં કાઉન્સિલો નિષ્ફળ રહી છે.

આજના યુગમાં વાંચન, લાયબ્રેરી વગેરેનું મહત્વ જોવાઈ રહ્યું છે. વળી ડીજીટલ યુગમાં લાયબ્રેરીની સુવિધાથી આરોગ્ય, વાંચન, સાક્ષરતા અને ડીજીટલ સ્કીલની સાથે લોકોને રોજગાર પણ મળે છે. પરંતુ કાઉન્સિલ તરફથી ફન્ડીંગ કટ અને મની શેવીંગ જેવા બહાના હેઠળ લાયબ્રેરી ક્લોઝીંગ એક ઈઝી ટાર્ગેટ બની રહ્યું છે.

સૌથી સ્વચ્છ શહેરોમાં સુરત પ્રથમ નંબરે

ભારતમાં કેન્દ્રીય પર્યાવરણ અને આબોહવા વગેરે માટે દેશનું પરિવર્તન મંત્રાલય સર્વે કરે છે. ૨૦૨૪ના સ્વચ્છ વાયુ સર્વેક્ષણ સર્વેમાં દેશભરના ૧૩૧ શહેરોને પછાડી ગુજરાતનું મુખ્ય હબ અને ડાયમંડ સીટી સુરત શહેરે નેશનલ ક્લીન એર સીટીમાં પ્રથમ નંબર હાંસિલ કર્યો છે. ઉપરાંત ચોખ્ખી (ક્લીન) હવા ધરાવતા શહેર તરીકે પણ તેણે નામના મેળવી છે. ૨૦૨૩માં સુરત આ શ્રેણીમાં ૧૩માં નંબરે હતું. પરંતુ સુરત મહાનગરપાલિકાના અથાગ

પ્રયત્નોના કારણે તે પ્રથમ નંબર મેળવવામાં સફળ થયું છે. સૌથી ઝડપથી વિકસીત થઈ રહેલા શહેરોમાં સુરત શહેર પણ આગવું સ્થાન ધરાવે છે.

જયપુરમાં યોજાયેલ એક ખાસ સમારંભમાં રાજસ્થાનના મુખ્યપ્રધાનના હસ્તે સુરતના મેયર દક્ષેસ માવાણી અને મ્યુનિસિપલ કમિશ્નર શાલિની અગ્રવાલને એવોર્ડ અને દોઢ કરોડ રૂપિયાનો ચેક અર્પણ કરવામાં આવ્યો હતો.

લેબેનોન ખાતે પેજરમાં બોમ્બ ધડાકા

૧૭મી સપ્ટેમ્બરના રોજ લેબેનોનના બૈરૂત ખાતે એકી સાથે અનેક પેજરોમાં વિસ્ફોટ થતા ૧૨થી વધુ માણસોના મૃત્યુ થયા હતા અને હજારો માણસો ઘવાયા હતા. જ્યારે લોકો મારકેટમાં ખરીદી કરી રહ્યા હતા કે ઘરોમાં અને ઓફિસોમાં હતા ત્યારે આ ધડાકાઓ તબક્કાવાર થયા હતા. આ પેજરોમાં તેની બેટરી પાસે નાના વિસ્ફોટ મુકાયા હતા એવું માનવામાં આવી રહ્યું છે. એક રિપોર્ટ મુજબ તાઈવાનની ગોલ્ડ એપોલો કંપનીના આ પેજરો લેબેનોન ખાતે આ વર્ષની શરૂઆતમાં હિઝબુલ્લાના માણસો માટે ખરીદવામાં આવ્યા હતા. પરંતુ આ પેજરો ત્યાં પહોંચે તે પહેલા ડીવાઈશમાં છેડછાડ કરવામાં આવી હતી અને એકી સાથે વિસ્ફોટ કરાય તેવી સુવિધા કરાઈ હતી. પેજર બનાવનાર કંપનીએ તેમની સંડોવણીને નકારી છે. અને કહ્યું છે આ પેજરો હંગેરીના બુડાપેસ્ટમાં એક કંપનીએ બનાવ્યા છે.

હીઝબુલ્લાહની ઈઝરાઈલ સાથે લડાઈ લાંબો સમયથી ચાલે છે. તે જોતાં આ માટે ઈઝરાઈલને જવાબદાર ઠેરવવામાં આવ્યું છે. પરંતુ ઈઝરાઈલે તેની જવાબદારી સ્વીકીરી નથી કે નકારી પણ નથી. આ બનાવ પછી ઈઝરાઈલે લેબેનોન ઉપર મિસાઈલ્સ હુમલાઓ શરૂ કર્યા હતા જેમાં ૭૦૦થી વધુ માણસો મૃત્યુ પામ્યા છે અને અનેક લોકો રહેઠાણ છોડી સલામત જગ્યાએ સ્થળાંતર કરી રહ્યા છે. હિઝબુલ્લાહ સંગઠને જવાબમાં ઈઝરાઈલ ઉપર રોકેટ હુમલાઓ કર્યા છે. આમ ગાઝા પછી હવે લેબેનોનને નિશાનો બનાવી ઈઝરાઈલ આ દેશોને ખતમ કરવા માંગે છે. યાદ રહે ૧૯૯૦ના દાયકામાં પેજરનું વિશ્વમાં ચલણ હતું પરંતુ મોબાઈલ ફોન અને પછી સ્માર્ટ ફોન આવતા પેજરના વપરાશનો લગભગ અંત આવ્યો હતો. મોબાઈલ ફોન હેક થવાની આશંકાથી લેબેનોનમાં પેજરનો વપરાશ વધ્યો હતો.

દીલ્હીના નવા મુખ્યમંત્રી આતિશી માર્લે

ગયા માસમાં દિલ્હીના મુખ્યમંત્રી તરીકે આતિશી માર્લેએ શપથ લીધા હતા. પૂર્વ મુખ્યમંત્રી અરવિંદ કેજરીવાલ છેલ્લા છ માસથી જેલમાં હતા. તેમના ઉપર દિલ્હી શરાબ કૌભાંડમાં સંડોવણીનો આરોપ છે. ઈડી તથા સીબીઆઈએ તેમના ઉપર કેસ દાખલ કરી જેલ ભેગા કર્યા હતા. સુપ્રિમ કોર્ટ મારફત તેમને જામીન મળતા તેઓ જેલમાંથી બહાર આવ્યા હતા. પરંતુ સુપ્રિમ કોર્ટે તેમના મુખ્યપ્રધાનની જવાબદારી અને પાવર પર અંકુશ લગાવતા તેમણે રાજીનામું આપ્યું હતું અને આતિશીને દિલ્હીનો કાર્યકાળ ફેબ્રુઆરી-૨૦૨૫માં પૂરો થાય ત્યાં સુધી મુખ્ય પ્રધાન બનાવાયા છે. આતિશીએ ઓક્ષફર્ડ યુનિવર્સિટીમાંથી ભણતર મેળવ્યું છે અને આમ આદમી પાર્ટીમાં તેમની અગત્યની ભૂમિકા રહી છે. કેજરીવાલ અને મનીષ સિસોદીયા બન્ને જેલમાં હતા ત્યારે તેમણે તેમની ગેરહાજરીમાં કુશળ રીતે દિલ્હીનું શાસન સંભાળ્યું હતું.
