2024: How the Genocide in Gaza fuelled global solidarity with Palestine



When Hamas attacked Israel on Oct. 7, 2023, Israel had the sympathy of the Western world.

However, within days that sympathy had all but disappeared, swept away by rising revulsion at the slaughter unleashed in Gaza by the Israel Defense Forces. By Oct. 24, 2023, just 17 days after the Hamas-led attack, UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres was urging the UN Security Council to rein in Israel. He had

"condemned unequivocally the horrifying and unprecedented acts of terror by Hamas in Israel."

But now, he said, "those appalling attacks cannot justify the collective punishment of the Palestinian people" being meted out by Israel in Gaza. "Even war has rules," he added.

By then, more than a million Palestinians had already been displaced and 5,000 had

been killed, according to Gaza's health authorities, including more than 1,100 women and 2,000 children, along with journalists, medics, and first responders.

Even before Guterres spoke out, thousands appalled by Israel's behavior had already begun to take to the streets in Western capitals to express their horror and offer their moral support to the Palestinian people.

We will not stop supporting Palestine

Some of the first protests took place in the UK, on Oct. 15, just a week after the Hamas-led attack. In London, thousands rallied in response to a plea by the Palestine Solidarity Campaign and marched on Downing Street, home of the British prime minister.

Many carried Palestinian flags and banners with messages including "Free Palestine — end Israeli occupation" and "Stop bombing Gaza." The BBC's headquarters in Portland Place, central London, was daubed in red paint, symbolising what activists called the broadcaster's "complicity in Israel's genocide of the Palestinian people through biased reporting." In Parliament and in some sections of the media, the protestors were immediately accused of antisemitism and of supporting Hamas.

"This is not about Hamas," said a protestor. "This is about protecting Palestinian lives."

The protests spread like wildfire to other cities and campuses throughout the UK and then to Europe, the Middle East and Asia. By the end of October, demonstrations had erupted in Copenhagen, Rome, Stockholm, and Wellington.

In France, despite a ban on pro-Palestinian rallies, protests still braved arrest to make their voices heard in Paris and Marseille.

END GENOGIDE IN GAZA The protests were no flash in the pan, either. Into the new year and up until today, they have kept on coming.

As the death toll in Gaza mounted, reaching 30,000 by March 2024, it was not long before the outrage spread to the US, where on March 20 NBC reported that "in cities across the country, highways have been blocked, trains have been delayed and sections of college campuses have been shut down by hundreds of thousands of people who have taken to the streets ... protesting Israel's invasion of Gaza."

A week later, on March 27, a Gallup poll found that a majority of Americans opposed Israel's military action in Gaza.

During a speech on the election campaign trail in North Carolina, President Joe Biden was interrupted by protesters demanding a US intervention to end the suffering of the Palestinians.

Their shouts turned to cheers when the president heard them out and then said: "They have a point. We need to get a lot more care into Gaza." Dismay at the administration's failure to rein in Israel, especially among the influential Arab American community in some key swing states, may well have cost Biden's VP Kamala Harris the presidency.

Everywhere, alarmed by the strength of global feeling provoked by the suffering of Palestinians in Gaza, the pro-Israel lobby rallied. Unable to defend Israel's actions in Gaza, instead it went on the attack. The protests, they said, were not pro-Palestinian or even anti-Israel, but antisemitic — an allegation that is frequently leveled at anyone who has criticised Israel's behavior in Gaza and the West Bank.

In the UK, the lengths to which the pro-Israel lobby was prepared to go to distract attention away from the cause of the protests became evident after an extraordinary episode in April. The media rushed to report the claims of Gideon Falter, the chief executive of the Campaign Against Antisemitism, that he had accidentally stumbled into the path of a pro-Palestinian protest and had then been threatened with arrest because his "openly Jewish" appearance was antagonising the marchers. The incident was filmed, and selectively edited, by the CAA.

But when the full footage later emerged it became clear that Falter had deliberately tried to provoke demonstrators by pushing past police officers and walking in the path of the demonstration. In the US, wealthy Jewish donors banded together to attack universities for allowing pro-Palestinian protests on their campuses. According to a report by CNBC, even as protests were taking off in the US in late October 2023, billionaire supporters of Ivy League schools including Harvard, Yale, and Penn threatened to withdraw funding.



By January 2024, the wealthy donors had successfully hounded out of office two high-profile leaders, Harvard president Claudine Gay and Penn president Liz Magill, both of whom resigned.

In an op-ed published in the Guardian in January 2024, Robert Reich, a former US secretary of labor, wrote that "as a Jew, I also cannot help but worry that the actions of these donors — many of them Jewish, many from Wall Street — could fuel the

very antisemitism they claim to oppose, based on the age-old stereotype of wealthy Jewish bankers controlling the world."

The determined assault on the defenders of Palestine by the Jewish lobby has continued unabated.

In the UK last week, the head of the British Medical Association was accused by campaign group Labour Against Antisemitism of creating "a hostile environment" for Jewish doctors, and is now under investigation by her own organization.

Dr. Mary McCarthy's "offense" was to have reposted a message on her X account that described the conflict in Gaza as "a holocaust."

Over in Ireland, Israel is to close its embassy in Dublin, accusing the Irish government of "extreme anti-Israel policies" and "crossing every red line."

Assad should still be held accountable under international law.

The Assad regime is no more.

The road to Damascus was surprisingly short. Syrian rebel groups took control of the capital after a lightning-fast offensive across the country.

Dictator Bashar al-Assad abdicated power and left Syria, according to Russia, his most powerful patron.

How did this happen so swiftly after Syria's thirteen-year civil war? And what comes next for Syria, the Middle East, and the external powers that have been shaping events there?

Syrians have worked thirteen long years to take down their dictator—and an even longer fifty-plus years if you count the whole of the now defunct Assad dynasty.

The international community must centre Syrians in this moment, respect their aspirations for their country, and support them in achieving the pluralistic vision of a free, democratic Syria that so many fought for with their lives and livelihoods.

Even before the shock of Assad's overthrow has worn off, Syrians who have spent more than a decade working on political processes, justice initiatives, and social change are swinging into action to realize the goals of their hard-won revolution.

On the justice front, the international community, global institutions, and

national courts can take immediate action to support Syrians. First, the chief prosecutor of the International Criminal Court (ICC) can hold Assad and his former officials to account by swiftly opening a preliminary examination into transboundary crimes in the Syrian conflict.

The ICC's mandate in the matter would be limited to crimes against humanity of deportation, persecution, and other inhumane acts committed against Syrian civilians who fled to Jordan, an ICC member state.

However, initiating a preliminary examination into these crimes would send a strong signal that the ICC is fit for purpose and that Assad will not continue to enjoy impunity for some of the worst crimes committed in this century.

And ICC member states can support this push by making their own referrals to the court, similar to their referrals on Ukraine and Palestine.

In tandem, efforts should be made to encourage any interim government in Syria to accept the jurisdiction of the court, similar to how Ukraine did in 2014, with a path to eventual ICC membership once a proper governance structure is established and laws passed.

Second, France can proceed with its Assad case. In June a French appeals court upheld an arrest warrant against Assad,

then a sitting head of state, for chemical weapons attacks against Syria's civilian population. This was precedent setting, due to questions around Assad's head of state immunity.

With that question no longer in dispute, the proceedings should move ahead and with the option for in absentia trials in the French system—where the defendant does not have to physically appear.

This means that Assad's reported presence in Moscow with a refusal to appear or inability to be extradited will be irrelevant to evidence being heard on this critical chapter in Syria's conflict.

This case in France is just one of many universal jurisdiction processes that are currently done, in progress, or anticipated in national courts with the ability to prosecute alleged perpetrators in the Syrian conflict for war crimes and crimes against humanity.

All those processes must continue and be supported by outside countries, particularly as more former Assad regime officials responsible for violations may try to leave Syria in this moment.

Lastly, there will be open questions about what will happen to the case now that The Netherlands and Canada have brought against the Assad regime at the International Court of Justice (ICJ) for violations of the Convention against Torture.

British Muslims give £70 billion to charity each year

British Muslims are the most generous group in the UK, contributing a mind boggling £70 billion to charity each, according to new research by the pioneering think tank Equi.

The report, compiled by Mohammed Sinan Siyech, a doctoral scholar at the University of Edinburgh and Sofia Lailah Shah, a researcher who read History and Politics at the University of Cambridge, showcases how British Muslims contribute to the United Kingdom economy across key sectors such as healthcare, the Civil Service, education, transportation and politics.

The report showcased how businesses owned by British Muslims contribute at least £24.7bn a year to the British economy, whilst employing hundreds of thousands of our people, helping revive local communities in places that have been facing economic decline.

In addition, British Muslims donate £1.79bn a year to charitable causes, four times more generously than the national average, and volunteer time worth £622m a year whilst the British Islamic Banking industry holds 85% of assets in the European Islamic Market, worth £5.73bn.

However, the report also raised the possibility of a 'Muslim brain drain', which could lead to losses of £1.1bn a year.

The report cited the fact that British Muslims are 50% more likely to want to leave the UK than the average British citizen.

British Muslims are three times more likely to cite religious Odiscrimination as a reason for leaving the UK. Over £62,000 are 65% more likely to want to leave the UK than the average British citizen.

Some focus group respondents suggested that moving to a Muslimmajority country allowed them to practice a "halal lifestyle" easily, including for their children. A policy advisor who had lived in Qatar for three years said, "The whole idea of the Islamic lifestyle tends to be more the idea that you can just be a Muslim without having to explain it.

"You don't have to explain to your employer, 'Oh, I need to take a couple of hours out because it's Jumma' (obligatory Friday prayers for Muslim men) ... It normalises that part of your life."

The poll also showed that British Muslims have a greater preference for the Middle East as destinations to move to, with respondents citing the UAE (46%), Qatar (32%), the US (24%), Saudi Arabia (24%), and Turkey (20%) as the top 5 destinations they would consider moving to compared to the average Briton who preferred white majority countries, including Spain (29%), Australia (21%), the US (20%), New Zealand (14%), and France (14%).

Considering the projected growth rate of the UK population over the next 10 years and polling data highlighting the numbers of those who have taken steps to leave, the UK is liable to lose between £234 million and over £1.1 billion in annual taxes, as well as potential sources of employment in the next ten years.

The report primarily directs its policy recommendations towards the UK government.

The government has the opportunity to acknowledge and encourage British Muslim contributions to the nation's economic growth and prosperity and create an environment that encourages them to stay in the UK.

Furthermore, recommendations within the report address issues prevalent throughout the UK, that would invariably have a very positive impact for all UK citizens. The report said the Treasury should acknowledge the £70bn Muslim contribution to the UK economy per annum and work with Muslim communities, through joint events.

Given that the halal industry is one of Europe's fastest-growing sectors and the UK is among the top non-Muslim countries with halal tourism, government must deepen its understanding of how to foster this market further.

The report also said the government should collaborate with Muslim communities to better understand Muslim

One cigarette takes 20 minutes off your life!

in 2025 after researchers at University College London found that on average a single cigarette takes about 20 minutes off a person's life, meaning that a typical pack of 20 cigarettes can shorten a person's life by nearly seven hours.

According to the research, if a smoker on 10 cigarettes a day quits on 1 January, they could prevent the loss of a full day of life by 8 January. They could boost their life expectancy by a week if they quit until 5 February and a whole month if they stop until 5 August. By the end of 2025, the research found they could actually avoid losing 50 days of life, the assessment found.

"People generally know that smoking is harmful but tend to underestimate just how much," said Dr Sarah Jackson, a principal research fellow at UCL's alcohol and tobacco research group. "On average, smokers who don't quit lose around a decade of life. That's 10 years of precious time, life moments, and milestones with loved ones."

Smoking is one of the world's leading preventable causes of disease and death,

Smokers are being urged to kick the habit killing up to two-thirds of long-term users, causing about 80,000 deaths a year in the UK and a quarter of all cancer deaths in England.

> The study, commissioned by the Department of Health, draws on the latest data from the British Doctors Study, which began in 1951 as one of the world's first large studies into the effects of smoking, and the Million Women Study, which has tracked women's health since 1996.

> While an earlier assessment in the BMI in 2000 found that on average a single cigarette reduced life expectancy by about 11 minutes, the latest analysis published in the Journal of Addiction nearly doubles the figure to 20 minutes - 17 minutes for men and 22 minutes for women.

> "Some people might think they don't mind missing out on a few years of life, given that old age is often marked by chronic illness or disability.

> "But smoking doesn't cut short the unhealthy period at the end of life," Jackson insisted. "It primarily eats into the relatively healthy years in midlife, bringing forward the onset of ill-health. This means

a 6o-year-old smoker will typically have the health profile of a 70-year-old nonsmoker."

Although some smokers live long lives, others develop smoking-related diseases and even die from them in their 40s. The variation is driven by differences in smoking habits such as the type of cigarette used, the number of puffs taken and how deeply smokers inhale. People also differ in how susceptible they are to the toxic substances in cigarette smoke.

The authors stress that smokers must quit completely to get the full benefits to health and life expectancy.

Previous work has shown there is no safe level of smoking: the risk of heart disease and stroke is only about 50% lower for people who smoke one cigarette a day compared with those who smoke 20 a day.

"Stopping smoking at every age is beneficial, but the sooner smokers get off this escalator of death the longer and healthier they can expect their lives to be," they insist.

Parking charges introduced at 15 Kirklees car parks

Parking charges have been introduced at 8op per hour for the first three hours. 15 Kirklees car parks.

Although the car parks were previously free to use, the charges have come into effect following a decision made by Kirklees Council.

Drivers using the car parks will be entitled to two hours of free parking before hourly charges apply.

Kirklees Council initially proposed bringing in the charges at 57 free car parks under its jurisdiction.

However, they scaled back the plans following a great deal of anger from the community. The fees apply to car parks with 25 spaces, and most charges begin at

Some of the sites will only be able to charge £6.50 for five hours or more. The one exception is Field Lane in Batley, where drivers have to pay £1.60 for four hours and then £3.50 for all day.





યુ.કે. ખાતે બહાર પડેલ એક રિપોર્ટમાં જણાવવામાં આવ્યું છે કે, વર્ષ ૨૦૨૩માં ઈંગ્લેન્ડ અને વેલ્સમાં છોકરાનું સૌથી પ્રિય નામ મોહંમદ છે. વાલિઓની પહેલી પસંદ મોહંમદ ના નામની રહી છે. આમ તો ૨૦૧૬થી મોહંમદ નામ પ્રથમ ટોપ ૧૦ માં આવતું રહ્યું હતું. પરંતુ ૨૦૨૩માં તેણે અંગ્રેજી નામ નોહા, ઓલીવર વગેરેને પાછળ પાડી પ્રથમ નંબર હાંસિલ કર્યો છે. બીજા નંબરે નોહ, ત્રીજા નંબરે ઓલીવર ચોથા નંબરે જ્યોર્જ નામનો સમાવેશ છે. ભારતમાં મુસલમાનોની વસ્તી લગભગ ૧૫૮કા છે. ત્યાં પણ ૨૦૨૨માં મોહંમદ નામ સૌથી પ્રિય છે અને પ્રથમ ક્રમે રહ્યું હતું. જ્યારે કે હિન્દુ નામ શિવાંશ બીજા નંબર અને ધ્રુવ નામ ત્રીજા નંબરે છે. ઈસ્લામમાં છોકરાઓનું નામ પ્યગમ્બર મોહંમદ (સ.અ.વ.)ના નામને રાખવામાં મહત્વતા આપવામાં આવે છે.

કર્કલીસમાં ડસ્ટબીન બાબતે લોકોનો વિજય
